Chris Lawton was asked to present what the issues are with the Shaw project. He stated the two concerns were the wetlands and the stormwater prevention plan. He explained the stormwater prevention plan, then went on to discuss the wetlands issue. The Army Corps of Engineers would make the determination as to whether there's a wetland there or not.

Discussion continued regarding the question as to whether there's a wetland on the property or not. Mr. DeMore asked the opinion of the board. Board members expressed their opinions on that, and agreed that, though they were not qualified to delineate whether it's a wetland, in the opinion of the board, it's not a wetland. Mr. Breitzka reiterated that no one on this board is qualified to go out there and make that determination as to whether there's a wetland or not, but that's the stance of the board.

Next came the following resolution:

Motion to appoint the Tully Joint Planning Board as lead agency for the SEQR process. Motion by Chairman Steve Bielecki. Second by Member John Casey. Motion carried 5 ayes, 0 nayes.

Mr. Bielecki read the questions and the answers on the SEQR form and proceeded to sign the document as chairperson of the joint planning board.

Mr. DeMore asked if a retainer agreement for the development fees was signed as part of the application process. Brief discussion followed.

Mr. DeMore stated that County Planning would report out tomorrow based on everything submitted.

Mr. DeMore advised that we have to have one more meeting, a public hearing, on October 26th at 7:00pm. And at that point, after that, if you're comfortable, we can approve the site plan.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM.
