Financial Report

Mr. Chartrand reviewed the Monthly Statement of Supervisor for April including court fines; tax collector was \$230 under budget; ambulance revenues are coming in slower than usual. On the expense side, nothing out of the ordinary to report.

School Budget Overview

Superintendent Robert Hughes and Business Administrator Brad Corbin presented an overview of the 2016-2017 school budget. Issues discussed included academics, graduation rates, built-in capitol reserve for long term projects, declining enrollment and the addition of a full-day Pre-K program. The four propositions on the ballot were also reviewed. Included in those propositions was the library budget which was presented in brief by Betsy Shahan.

Parks and Recreation

Ryan Dando reported that last month was a very busy month. Last weekend, an opening day parade took place for baseball and softball, and over 100 children and parents participated. Ryan thanked the fire department and the sheriffs for coming down to help out. Tully also hosted a Pitch, Hit and Run competition which was a countywide event and which Ryan felt was a success as well.

Upcoming events will be the Moo Run which is set for June 10th, and the Green Lake opening at the end of June. Most of the 12 to 13 lifeguards will be returning. Ryan mentioned he was able to hire a new head lifeguard who is a teacher in Jamesville-Dewitt, so she comes to us with a lot of experience.

Mr. Lund advised that he had received some positive comments about the baseball program especially with the shirts being delivered on time.

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Highway

John Herold reviewed highway activities as follows: had another good month, but the weather did change some scheduling around. We did not have any major repairs. As far as Earth Day, we did not have a lot of garbage, probably due to the weather. We did start our road repairs.

Spring Cleanup Day is this Saturday, so the dumpsters should be in there by tomorrow. And the last thing, we did hire Jake Pitman back for the summer mowing.

Councilor Speziale asked about the guardrail on the corner of Route 281 and Meeting House Road. Brief discussion followed.

Ambulance

Captain Bryan Ramsay reported on EMS calls for April which numbered 40 as compared to 22 in March.

The "Check & Inject" program is going very well, and we will be setting up training for that and then a refresher course that will be completed as well.

Bryan reported that he will be setting up a CEVO course for all ambulance drivers to attend. He's been teaching this course for several years and will cover the eight Central New York counties, teaching other fire and EMS agency staff as well.

On April 24th, Bryan sent out letters to part-time staff inquiring as to whether they will be staying on with us or not. Five letters came back asking to continue their employment with Tully, and only one resigned.

We have added two drivers in training hoping that they will fill in the open shifts.

And finally, Bryan asked the board to approve the purchase of three reconditioned Panasonic Toughbook computers for two ambulances and the medic car. Total project cost is \$6,346.02 which includes mounting.
