Village Water System Improvements Project

As I am sure you have noticed from the equipment and dirt in the village, the water system improvements project has resumed with the melting of the snow. Last fall we replaced water mains everywhere that we could without disturbing any sidewalks. We wanted to be sure that the sidewalks remained intact over the winter, so that they could be cleared to ensure the safety of school children walking to school and home each day, as well as for all residents who prefer to walk as they do their daily errands. We also replaced the old reservoir with a new glass-lined steel tank. The switch over went seamlessly, and we are so pleased with our new, safer, fully enclosed water source for the village. With the onset of winter weather, we took a pause.

Now that the project has resumed, we will be completing the remaining water mains identified by the project throughout the village. Once the mains are in, individual properties will be tied in to the water system. This will cause brief interruptions in service, so residents will be given notice of when to expect service interruption.

Once the water lines are complete, the restoration work will begin. This will include replacing sidewalks and driveway aprons as well as tree and lawn restoration. Concurrently with the restoration work, the

main pump system will be brought up to ground level and the pump house building will be replaced.

We recognize the invasive and messy nature of this massive project. Once it is complete, our system will meet 10 State Standards- basically bringing us up to current code and setting us up for approximately 50 years of safe and efficient system operations. We have been very impressed with the professionalism of our contractors and engineer. North Country is owned by a Tully resident, and his commitment to our community and attention to detail has been exemplary. We greatly appreciate the patience that everyone has shown over the course of this endeavor.
