Fire Department To Do Preplanning

In an effort to ensure a safer and more efficient responses to emergencies and to further their training, the Tully Hose Company will be walking the village to preplan properties. What does pre-planning mean? It is a visual inspection of the property to observe any obstacles or unique elements of the property in case of fire or any other emergency that may arise. They will be noting such things as the nearest hydrant, building construction, roof access and locations of doors and windows. They will also observe for hazards to firefighters such as power lines, trees, propane grills, etc.

If you are at home when the fire company conducts its preplan they may have some questions for you such as location of interior staircases, basement and attic access, whether smoke detectors and/or carbon monoxide detectors are in use and whether there are any children, elderly or disabled persons living in the home. If you have questions about fire safety such as placement of smoke detectors, escape plans or fire hazards please feel free to ask the firefighters who come to your door. If you are not at home, when the preplan occurs firefighters will be leaving a form for the home owner or occupant to complete. This form will ask many of the questions they would ask if you were home.

The activity is planned for Monday June 26th, as their weekly drill. Your cooperation and assistance is entirely voluntary and you do not have to answer any questions or allow firefighters into your home. However, the intent of conducting this pre-planning exercise is to make the fire company's response to your emergency faster, more efficient and safer for all involved and therefore your cooperation and assistance would be greatly appreciated.
