Tully Parks and Rec Makes a Donation and a Difference

At the end of June, the Tully Parks and Recreation department was able to donate over 100 unused t-shirts to children in need in Ho, Ghana. This was part of a mission trip through the Eastern Hills Bible Church in Manlius. The shirts were given to students at the Brilliant Academy, a school set up by Eastern Hills, a local orphanage and a school dedicated to teaching local deaf and blind students.

Eastern Hills Bible Church teams up with a company called IJM, the International Justice Mission. Together they work to stop child labor and trafficking on Volta Lake in Ghana. Along with t-shirts, the program also donates school supplies,

hygiene products, first aid supplies, flipflops and other sports supplies. Soccer is really the only game that these kids are introduced to, so by having new t-shirts the

kids are able to separate into different teams and organize games.

The Tully **Parks** Recreation department is extremely honored to have been able to help these Ghanaian children in need. We see the excitement and fun our own local children playing organized recreational sports and are

thrilled that we are able to spread this excitement all the way to Africa! This program takes place each year, and we will look to help out in the future.
