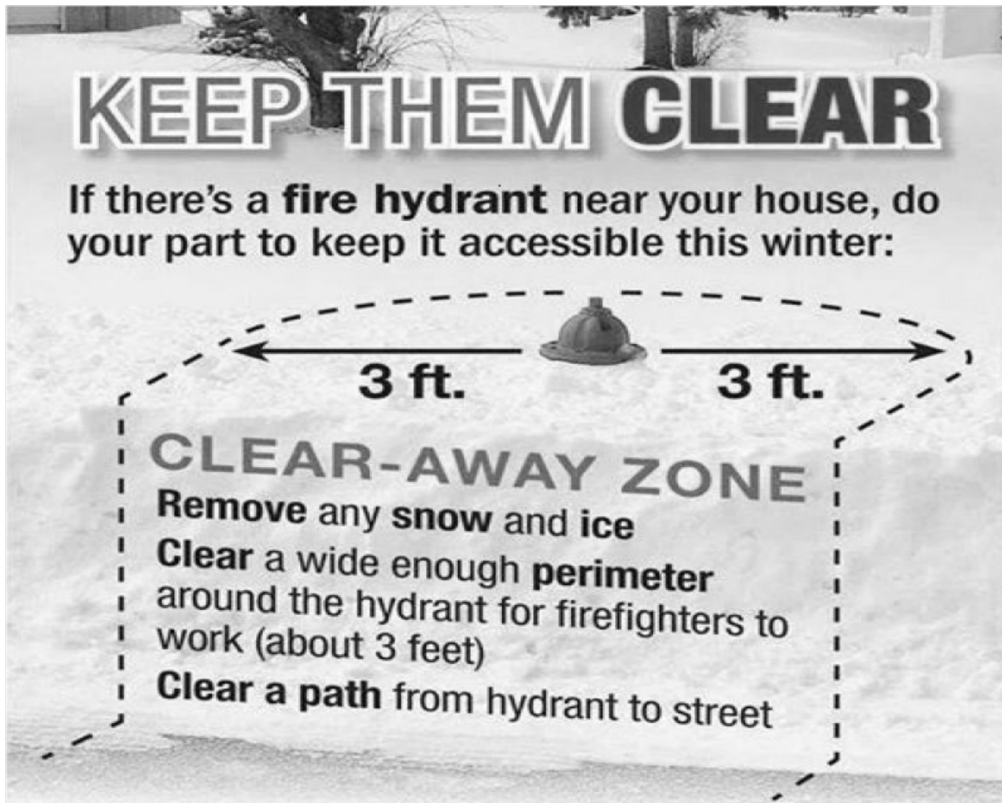

DAYS GONE BY

Here are a few excerpts from a December 1975 "In Retrospect" column from the Tully Independent that I felt worth sharing. These are reflective of holiday times in Tully during the late 1800's-early 1900's

Local shopping for gifts in 1884 included H. B Scammell & Son who were well stocked with dolls dressed "in the height of fashion". Their music boxes were everybody's favorite. Most in demand, however, was the toy depicting a monkey riding a bicycle. That same year M. W. Hayford & Son did a brisk business in colored glassware, in Polka Dot and Craquelle patterns.

Moving up to 1918, Brown & Hayford invited customers to stop in for a Christmas smoke. Next door at Tully Cash Market were oysters for the Christmas Eve get-together for fifty cents a quart. R. H. Gallinger's Corner Store was providing sugar for Christmas goodies at twelve cents a pound. Mr. Gallinger's high grade Blue Ribbon coffee was thirty cents a bag. In 1920 you could mail Christmas Greetings for one-and-a-half cents if you did not seal the envelope. The stockings hung with care bulged with big golden oranges purchased in 1922 from Wheeler & Fellows, priced at forty-eight cents a dozen.

In my growing up years in the 1950's, how we all loved shopping at Long's Department Store, Loie's Gift Shoppe, and Wortley's Drug Store where our meager allowances could buy gifts for the whole family. Another favorite memory of mine is standing around the piano, while my mother played, singing Christmas Carols. Life was GOOD!
