# CNYSPCA

Promoting Kindness to Animals

On January 1st of 2018, the switch in Dog Control will be turned over to the CNYASPCA. The dog control is just for dogs. Cats and wildlife will not be handled by the CNYASPCA.

The process for redemption will remain the same, the dog will need proof of current license in Tully before being redeemed. If the dog does not have a license then they will need to obtain one with the town clerk before the dog will be released. If the dog does not have proof of rabies for their license, then SPCA is able to administer a rabies shot when a veterinarian is present which is typically 1 to 3 days per week.

This is the number to call if they have found/seen a dog running at large that needs to be picked up. Mark Kulak is the DCO and is excellent about returning phone calls when he is in the office and they need only leave one message. If he is out on PTO then we do have one of our cruelty officers cover for him.

This will be for anyone looking to reclaim a lost dog of theirs that would like instructions on how to do so or any redemption questions that might have. This number will bring you directly to our operator who will return the call if they do not answer.

Even though it feels like winter may never end, Spring is just around the corner. Now is the time begin ordering trees and shrubs for planting.

The Village of Tully is taking tree and shrub requests from Village and Town of Tully residents. All trees and shrubs are \$2.00 each. The plants arrive with bare roots and should be planted in the spring, after the last frost. The following trees and shrubs are being offered:

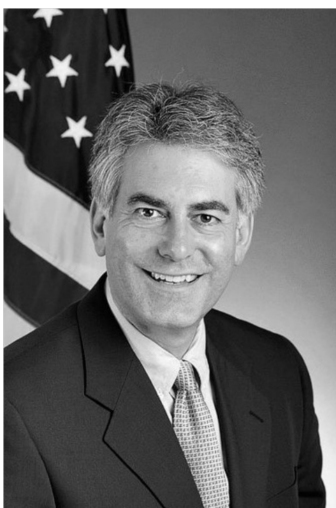


Common Lilac (*Syringa vulgaris*): 8-12' leggy, upright shrub. Full sun. Fertile and well drained soil. Nesting for song birds. Fragrant.

Tulip Tree (*Liriodendron tulipifera*): Fast growth rate. Sun/partial shade. Moderately moist, deep, well drained soil. Fragrant.

Eastern Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*) 20-30' tree, one of the first to flower in spring. Thrives in many soil types.

## Technology Tips

In this day and age of technology, it's easy to get and share information. It's also just as easy for someone to take over your account and damage your reputation as well as your finances or identity. So here are the top 10 tips to stay safe on social media:

1. Use a strong password. The longer it is, the more secure it will be.
2. Use a different password for each of your social media accounts.
3. Set up your security answers. This two factor authentication is available for most social media sites and don't give your answers out on forwarded posts.
4. If you have social media apps on your phone, be sure to password protect your device.
5. Be selective with friend requests. If you don't know the person, don't accept their request. It could be a fake account.
6. Click links with caution. Social media accounts are regularly hacked. Look out for language or content that does not sound like something your friend would post.
7. Be careful about what you share. Don't reveal sensitive personal information i.e.: home address, financial information, phone number. The more you post the easier it is to have your identity stolen.
8. Become familiar with the privacy policies of the social media channels you use and customize your privacy settings to control who sees what.
9. Protect your computer by installing antivirus software to safeguard. Also ensure that your browser, operating system, and software are kept up to date.
10. Remember to log off when you're done.
