The Signature at Cornerstone

Many elements of architect Mel Moore's Cornerstone Park design are now complete, such as walkways, planters with flowers and trees, sitting walls, symbolic plank road, a Celebration Paver Walkway and the addition of a historic antique plow, beautifully restored by the Tully High School FFA. So many local residents have contributed to this process and Tully Action Group (TAG) wishes to thank everyone. Truly "It does take a Village". All of these elements are important to the design, but none more important than the symbolic foundation wall along Elm street with the attached Cornerstone letters.

The cost of the supporting underground foundation for the signature wall, plus the utilities were paid for by TAG's various fund raisers. This installation consisted of excavation, building a frame form, pouring of concrete with appropriate stabilizing rebar, and then placing a base of concrete block sufficient to hold and stabilize the weight of the above-ground structure. With this in place, the site was ready for the contractor to build the wall which is shown in this photograph.

Fortunately, at this point, a local resident, Mrs. Kathy Pfiester, pictured here, came forward to donate the funds needed to build the wall. She said that she wanted to help out in a significant way that would make her proud to be a resident of the Village. Kathy has donated to the park in numerous ways, such as purchasing one of the new Ginkgo trees added late last fall to the fountain planters as a memorial to her late husband, Walter Pfiester.

With the wall in place, TAG went shopping for the cornerstone letters and just as new monies were needed, Green Lakes Associates were looking for a way to make a contribution to the park. They approved and donated the cost of the handsome letters which are now installed, and take pride of place fronting onto Elm Street as a beautiful signature name plate for Cornerstone Park.

There is still more to be done at Cornerstone and TAG will hold more fund raisers in 2018. Everyone will have a second chance to purchase an engraved paver for the extended Celebration Walkway. February Village Board Meeting

The Tully Village Board meeting on 2/7 brought to a close most of the Water Improvement Project, which has provided the new water tank at the top of Melinda Lane, and replaced the ancient water lines through many parts of the Village. Village residents have been extremely cooperative through this effort, in providing easements to allow the work to proceed across their property lines. The Village Engineer, Ken Teter, has been hard at work overseeing this project, along with the help of the Village Accountant, Tom Chartrand. The leakage of unmetered water from the prior system has now been reduced from about 30%, to only 12%, a figure well within the excellent range. In order to keep our sewage lines unclogged, residents are asked not to flush any kind of 'wipes' down the toilet. Even though they may be advertised as flushable wipes, they accumulate and block the sewers.

Anyone interested in volunteering to provide snow removal on private walkways is encouraged to give their contact information to the Village (696-5041) so it can be listed on the village website: villageoftully.org. This is a great way to earn community service hours for those local organizations which require this.

Tully Area Historical Society

Organized in 1978, the Historical Society has been able to continue to maintain the two buildings at 22 and 24 State Street. The Society finances the maintenance of these building through the Fall Community Fair, November's Christmas at the Station, the Country Peddler Consignment Shop, the Twice Read Book Store, bequests and contributions.

The Country Peddler Consignment Shop is located at 22 State Street, and through the efforts of local volunteers is open for business five days a week. This Shop offers gently used clothing, toys, and household goods at affordable prices.

The Historical Museum and Twice Read Book Store are located at 24 State St. The Museum houses many historical artifacts, newspaper collections, and reference library for use in research projects. The Twice Read Book Store has thousands of books, fiction and nonfiction, as well as children's books at very affordable prices. 
HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE DAME AUDITIONS!
