This year on May 9th at a catered dinner and meeting we recognized Marilyn Twentyman Stoker as our Tully Senior Citizen of the Year. Marilyn has put others before herself, looked for ways to make life easier or better for others, volunteered to organize events or efforts to assist others, worked shoulder to shoulder with others in the community, asked for nothing in return except for the satisfaction of knowing she has helped others and made a better community for us all. Among many other achievements, Marilyn worked at the Preble Milk Co-op for 17 years and served as Preble Town Justice for 20 years. Marilyn was awarded a plaque "For Being a Model of Achieving the Art of Aging Well", and received a proclamation in her honor from New York State Assemblyman Al Stirpe. 


JFK Assassination Conspiracy Theories with author Stan Wilczek Jr
