NEW BOOK available at the Tully Area Historical Society


"Tully Cemetery Honors Our Veterans" was a book started by Eleanor Preston in 2015 and enhanced and recently completed by Nancy Porter, a volunteer and officer at the historical society.

The book is a compilation of information about all the veterans buried in the Tully Cemetery. It includes 60+ pages of the veteran's military service record and picture (if available) and their headstone in the cemetery. All military personnel are included.

ARTS DISTRICT GOES INTO DEVELOPMENT, SEEKS INPUT FROM EVERYONE

For the last several years, the Tully Arts
Council has been taking steps, including
grant writing, research, and agency
outreach, to bring commerce, out-of-town
money, and tourism to the Village and Town
of Tully through art. A five-point plan is in
place and largely underway, with the
intention of launching next year!

Almost three years ago, the council developed plans which led to a request that the Village Board designate the area around the one-and-only stoplight in the village as an arts district. While the designation does not affect zoning or value, it allows for grants to be written and for the district to be advertised as a fun, high-quality group of businesses. It will also add a splash of color to attract visitors to the area, which itself is full of natural beauty, and will brighten it up for those of us who live here.

The first step in making the district is the design, manufacture, and installation of seasonal poles with arts district banners in front of the stores and businesses. These poles will go up each year around Memorial Day and come down after Halloween; they will be thin and tall like flagpoles and sit in the grassy rights-of-way between the curb and the sidewalk. The banners are being designed now, and when we have a few choices, we will let people in town vote for the one they like best!

Additionally, plans are for each pole to be topped with a different metal sculpture that evokes either something about art or about Tully. When finished, this will make a walking tour that people visiting from out of town and townspeople alike can take and learn about Tully and its history, including that of its art.

We will be having an open gathering at the ArtWorks gallery in September to talk more about this concept and answer any questions people might have. As with all things related to the Arts Council, there will be yummy food
