## **New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG) Proposed Powerline**

At the Town Meeting in June, it was presented that New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG) , in an effort to comply with federal standards, is considering a plan to build a 345kV electric transmission line that will run parallel to an existing line stretching from Lafayette, in Onondaga County, down through Cortland County and ending outside of Binghamton.

The company is planning to pay property owners for a 150-foot easement to control the land where the line would be built. NYSEG is currently in the middle of a reassessment study which they plan to finish by the end of 2018.

In a statement, NYSEG said they will work closely with those in the line's path.

*“NYSEG is investing in electric system upgrades to comply with new federal standards. These Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) requirements will result in a more reliable and resilient energy grid. Over the next few years, NYSEG will be upgrading key substations and transmission infrastructure to meet current and future needs of local homes and businesses. Where possible, we will work in or beside existing transmission rights-of-way to minimize impacts. The company is working closely with its neighbors and welcomes their input to ensure that improvements are performed safely and with minimal disruption to the environment and the communities we serve. Public Open House meetings will be scheduled along the proposed route, and company representatives or field agents are always available to talk with landowners. We recognize that a successful outcome is one that benefits both parties. “*

## **Trash Removal**

The board of directors for the Southern Onondaga Trash System met July 12th and have secured a three year contract, with two one year renewable extensions to Dependable Disposal. Further information will be forth coming and will be posted on the Town of Tully website.

Wait—HOMER High School Auditorium? Yes—HOMER.



Unlike the Disney movie, the stage musical follows the story and ending from the Hugo novel, and therefore is powerful, poignant, and timely.
