Tully Historical Museum News


Recent historical artifacts received include a 1940's Maytag Wringer washing machine donated by the Shetler Family. Does that ever bring back childhood memories for many of us

The Mickelson Family recently donated a framed picture of Judson Wright, born in 1867, who was the first Pharmacist in Tully. He operated the J.S. Wright Drugstore on Warren Street (became known as "Old Reliable"). Judson is the Great Grandfather of Paula Mickelson. Judson's Father, John, operated a store back in 1860 located on Elm Street where he sold groceries, sundries and a limited supply of drugs.
