## **TULLY CLEANUP DAY IS OCTOBER 13<sup>th</sup>**

The CLEAN-UP DAY is ONLY for Village of Tully and Town of Tully residents. You must show proof of residency and accompany vehicle at drop-off site. Proof of residency must have your street address on it.

A Post Office Box will not be accepted as proof of residency. We are asking Town of Tully residents to restrict your dumping to your own household needs or we may be faced eliminating with eliminating this program to due cost.

We are also asking that you attempt to restrict the size of your trailers to single axle. You may make more than one trip, but in the interest of moving everyone through at a reasonable pace, overly large loads may be turned away.

#### NO PROOF OF RESIDENCY - NO DUMPING

All items must be less than 10 feet in length. All oil, gas and antifreeze products, which are not acceptable for disposal, must be drained from tanks and equipment.

\*\*\*IF YOU HAVE UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS ON BOARD, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON SITE\*\*\*

WILL ACCEPT:

Most General Rubbish, Appliances, Metal, Computers (Flat Screens Only), Electronics, Lawn & Garden Waste, Vehicle Batteries, Empty

Drums and Pails cut in half.

Tires will be accepted off the rim at a cost—(Prices subject to change)

Please have the correct amount of money. 16-inch and smaller tires: \$3.00 17-inch and larger-truck tires: \$7.00

Large tires: \$25.00

WILL NOT ACCEPT: Rechargeable or disposable household batteries, Fluorescent tubes, Brush, Garbage, TELEVISIONS, Recyclables, Pails with lids, Whole drums, Paints, Chemicals, Oil, Gas, Antifreeze or any Hazardous Waste

Please separate items to improve efficiency at disposal site.

DROP OFF STATION 1 – Tires, vehicle batteries, empty propane tanks, computer monitors, keyboards, microwaves and major electronic components

DROP OFF STATION 2 - General rubbish

DROP OFF STATION 3 – All metals & appliances except refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers and humidifiers

DROP OFF STATION 4 - Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, box springs & mattresses

DROP OFF STATION 5 – Lawn & garden waste

#### TRASH SERVICE

After a competitive process, SOTS (Southern Onondaga Trash System) has approved Dependable Disposal to provide the district with automated containerized trach collection. This new system has many advantages for the customer and the service provider like safer collection, fewer employee injuries, convenience to residents and cleanliness.

The new service provided totes will be distributed to homes beginning September 21 and be completed by November 3. The new totes must be used as soon as you receive them. Old trash containers can be disposed of by putting them into your new trash tote. OCRRA recycle bins can be turned into your local highway department. The new totes are displayed at the Tully Municipal Building.
