Please place **everything** in the tote, even if the lid doesn't close.

Please put each tote on opposite sides of your driveway or leave at least three (3) feet of clearance if placing them next to each other. This is due to the robotic arm which lifts your cans.





Please place your totes as close to the edge of the curb as possible and face the arrows on the lid toward the street. Please have your totes out the night before pickup. Dependable collection begins at 6 a.m.
