There were 32 robotics teams in competition that traveled from states all over the north east including Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Rhode Island and New York.

The team is judged over many areas including the team's connection with the community, working with experts, describing the problem solving and the design process; describing the efficiency and effectiveness of the parts of the robot; use of sensors and unique aspects of their robot. On top of all of those things, the team also needs to describe how they work as a team and team organization. They also need to explain how the they work together as well as how they work with other teams.

The team took home many honors from the

Vermont State Championship including:

2nd runner up - Motivate Award - Sparking others to embrace the culture of FIRST!

1st place Connect Award - Connecting the dots between community, FIRST, and the diversity of the engineering world technology.

1st runner up - Inspire Award - This is the overall top award. Tully's FIRST Tech Challenge team won 2nd place overall!

Alison Carr, as a follow-up to her attendance at RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards), was expected to construct a service project to help her community. Her goal when setting up this visit is to inform the community of the Canine Foster Program at Clear Path for Veterans. This program trains young puppies to become helpful service dogs for Veterans with a physical and/or mental disability. Although training dogs isn't a new service, raising the puppies on the property is the new goal. The program, in the coming months, will be looking for families to foster puppies for approximately 10 weeks (8 weeks to 18 weeks old).
