Tully Action Group would like to thank the Tully mayor for the Good news in the Village! Mayor Melissa Flint-Morgan has worked with County Legislature, Dave Knapp, to secure funding for three radar speed signs for the Village. The radar signs are now in and feasible locations on poles are being scouted out, all within the Village. This project should be completed within the coming months. Mayor Flint-Morgan would also like to remind everyone to be mindful and remove all distractions from view when driving, as there is a large increase in pedestrian and general traffic in the village throughout the summer.

TAG also thanks Donna Evans Orr and Jack Gleason for their role in bringing together community groups to discuss speeding problems in the village. Nancy Chawgo is also recognized for aiding the Mayor in this endeavor. Strong Communities grow out of strong Partnerships.

With the addition of monies from the last two fund raisers, the Mother's Day Hanging Basket Sale and the Perennial Plant Sale, TAG has given the go ahead for the construction of the fountain at Cornerstone Park. Mel Moore and Dave Hardy will be spending some time at the quarry to find the proper limestone for this exciting construction. Also, the construction of the final Celebration Walkway will complete the fountain Area. There are still a few open slots for engraved pavers. Back in History Nearly 100 years ago

Tully and the nation went dry Jan. 16, 1920 when the Volsted Act on Prohibition went into effect. The repeal of national prohibition which ratified the 21st amendment to the constitution came on Dec. 5, 1933.

Most of the nation went wet again, but Tully did not.

In 1935, 1938, 1947, and 1965 Propositions were voted down, and Tully remained dry.

In 1970 the Proposition to allow beer to be sold for off premises consumption at grocery stores passed, as well as the sale of wine & liquors at package stores was passed; 452 in favor; 383 against. The option permitting the sale of alcohol for on premise consumption at hotels serving meals also passed; 426 in favor; 404 against. Two other options: the sale of alcohol in a Tavern or Summer Hotel were defeated with over twice as many against as for.

The first Liquor Store was opened in 1972 by Richard Michelson; and the first Restaurant to be issued a license to serve alcohol for on premise consumption was the Woodshed Restaurant at Country Hills Resort on North Road operated by David & Donna Aungier. This option also allowed civic organizations to operate on an on-premises license at its social events.

The Victory Market began offering beer for sale, also in the 70's. Since then we have a variety of restaurants in the Village that now offer alcohol beverages. The newest business in our Township is ONCO Fermentations, Tully's own Microbrewery complete with a Tasting Room, currently open Thursdays-Sundays. Located behind Applied Concepts on Route 281, their entrance is actually on Meetinghouse Road. Check out their website www.oncoferment.com.

With that being said, we are still looking for a few more handmade arts/craft vendors and local bakers (breads, rolls, etc).

As we have done in the past, we will continue to sell the Tully, NY Pint glasses and stemless wine glasses. Some vendors will have them for purchase throughout the market and they can be found anytime at Earth 2 Soul and Rusty Wheel Pottery. The profit of these glasses goes towards our advertisement for the Kings Corner Market each year.
