Wild Parsnip - Beware!

The DEC and Cornell are both warning people about an invasive weed that has become a problem in our area: wild parsnip. Wild parsnip looks like Queen Anne's lace, only it is more robust, and with a taller (up to 5'), yellow, flower. Often found in open fields and lawns and along roadsides, the stems are hollow, grooved, hairless, thick and juicy, resembling celery. This weed is not only invasive, but it has the capacity to cause harmful burns when the juice gets on the skin, particularly in the sunlight.

The DEC advises cutting the root off a few inches below the ground or pulling the whole plant out to remove it, although mowing before seeds develop can work as well. It is most

important to cut down the plant before the flower heads turn to seeds in order to stop its spread. If disposing of flower heads that have gone to seed, it is suggested that they be put in a black plastic bag and left in the sun for one week to kill the seeds.



Contact with any

part of the plant should be avoided, especially with the sap. Long sleeves, long pants, and gloves are recommended. If there is skin contact with the sap, immediate washing with soap and water and covering it for at least 48 hours is suggested to prevent exposure to sunlight. If there is a reaction (a burn), a visit to a health care provider is recommended.
