Tully Alumni Annual Gathering

Irene Gorney Pearson, 1941 graduate, was the eldest TCS Alumni to attend their Annual Event August 10th. The tribute theme this year was a dedication to Mary A. Austin for her 37 years of teaching English at Tully High School. In addition to teaching Mary A. was a Senior Class Advisor for several years; directed both elementary and high school drama productions; and was advisor for the Junior-Senior Speaking Contest. As a part of the tribute display, there were charcoal drawings done by her in college days; as well as a beautiful canvas tapestry. Many in attendance at the luncheon spoke of her impact on their school years, which carried over to their adulthood. Several regular attendees and guests enjoyed meeting and greeting friends and acquaintances from the past.

Total attendance was 107. Celebrating 65 years as graduates, the class of 1954 had 7; the class of 1959 had 10; the class of 1964 had 7, the class of 1969 celebrating their 50th had 22 in attendance. The Tully Alumni Association dates back to 1898 with their purpose defined to gather annually, and to maintain a listing of graduates. We strive to continue both traditions, and look forward to next year's event to be held August 15th.
