Many rural cemeteries are experiencing challenging times in maintaining their properties. The Tully Cemetery Association strives to keep their grounds well groomed, repair monument foundations, and perform necessary equipment maintenance. This past year it became necessary to repair the waterline due to pipe leaks. There is a need to replace mower/trailer equipment, which were purchased in 1996 and 2008. Our trimmers were purchased in 2004 and 2009.

Although a portion of the Lot Cost includes perpetual care, costs of operating expenses have accelerated. To avoid having to continually increase our Lot and Burial costs, we are encouraging lot owners to consider making a monetary donation to Tully Cemetery.

Bakeless Bake Sale 2020

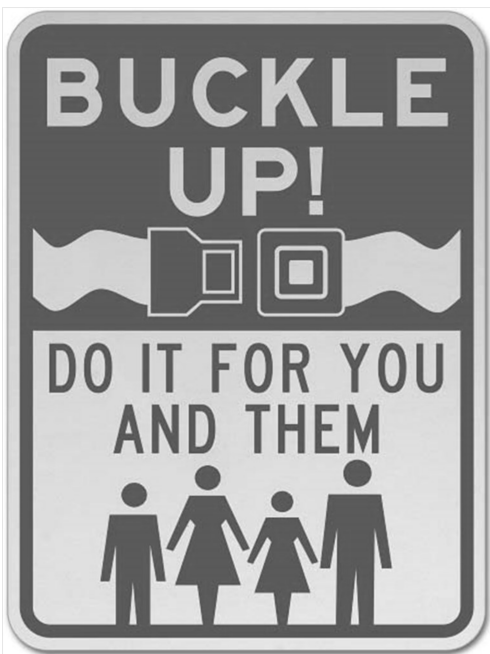
