

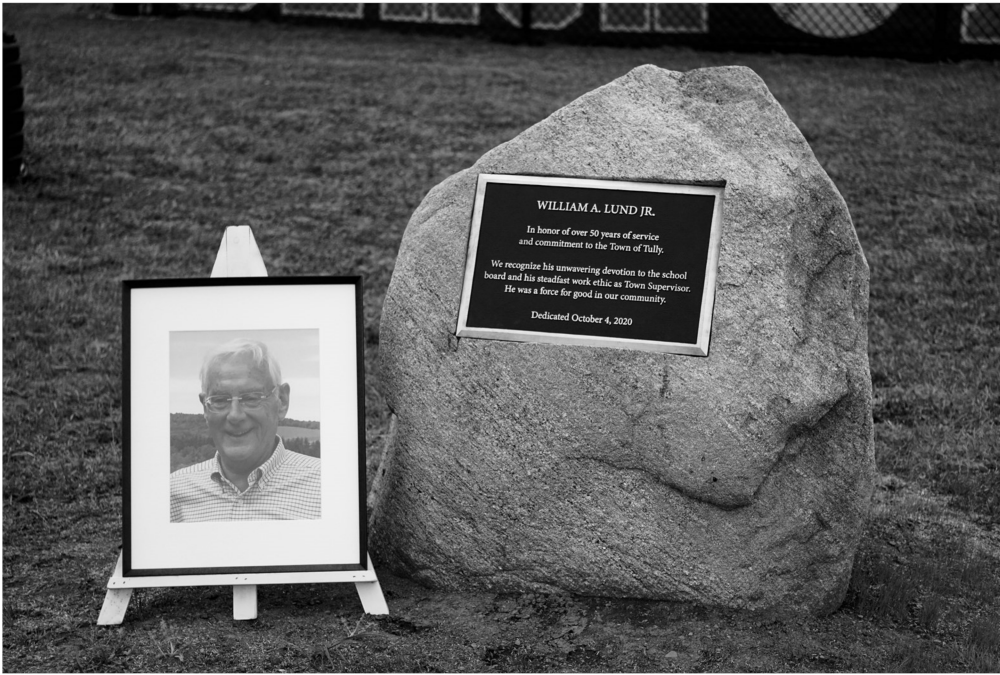

The game saw Tully defeat the Cortland Jr. Crush 4-1. Tully starter Dan Mech proved stingy on the mound, allowing only a walk in 3 innings to pick up the win.
