

The Covid-19 pandemic has shown us that reliable access to broadband internet is a vital resource for any community in the 21st Century. From education, health care, jobs, and agriculture, our future relies on reliable access to internet.

The Central New York Regional Planning and Development Board has partnered with Onondaga County and ECC Technologies, LLC to undertake a community survey that will be used to help prepare a plan to improve broadband internet access for communities in Onondaga County and across Central New York.

By completing this survey, you will help Onondaga County plan for a connected future. At the bottom of this page is more information about each part of the survey.

There are separate surveys for residents and businesses to complete. Please make sure that you have clicked on the appropriate tab for the county where your residence or business is located. If you run a business from your home, we encourage you to fill out both a residential and a business survey to help identify your unique needs.

If you know someone who wants to complete the survey but does not have internet access, please have them contact the CNY RPDB at (315) 412-5966 for assistance. If necessary, a survey will be mailed to them directly.

You have two options if you are ready to start the survey now. If you are taking the survey from your home or business, or from a mobile device connected to your home's Wi-Fi, please complete both the speed test and the questionnaire.

If you are taking the survey from a public location, are not at your home or business, or are taking the survey from a mobile device not connected to your home's Wi-Fi, please skip the speed test and complete the questionnaire only.

The community survey will take place over the next three months from May 1, 2021 through July 31, 2021. Please do not wait – have your voice heard today.

#### **Community Solar Farm**

David Khasidy presented the following message to the board for the residents of Tully.

Thanks to ClearPath Energy and the Tully Town Board - residents now have access to solar energy and solar energy savings without the need for a rooftop or land to install panels.

Late this summer, construction will begin on three Community Solar farms accounting for 21 MW of ClearPath Energy's 46 MW New York state portfolio. The energy generation will serve both residential and commercial subscribers in the National Grid service territory which spans 33 counties across New York State from Buffalo to Albany.

Businesses, municipalities, and residents of New York State all have the opportunity to opt into ClearPath Energy's subscription program and the savings it will provide. Subscribers will receive a credit on their monthly utility bill.

It is not required for you to be a homeowner. You are not required to install panels. There is no sign-up cost, and you can unsubscribe at any time without penalty. Even better - you make absolutely no change to your current utility provider. We simply inform them, through submitting your National Grid account number, that you are receiving a percentage of the benefits the community solar project affords its subscribers.

Together we'll take one step forward towards financial savings and energy independence.
