Update from Supervisor Masters

The Town Board continues to work on the Rt. 11A Water District. As many Tully residents are aware, Allied Chemical / Honeywell had a situation many years ago which contaminated the water in Tully Valley with salt. Honeywell has been maintaining a "water supply" to the residents of the Tully Valley, but now Honeywell is working to leave the area. With significant assistance from Dave Knapp, our County Legislator, we have been working with Honeywell to fund the formation of a water district that will be managed by OCWA.

This project has been complicated by the increased cost of materials driven by such things as, the Covid crisis. We continue to work with all parties, and I feel we are getting very close to a workable agreement.

I want to emphasize that the cost of this project will be borne by Honeywell and the standard water fees from those served by the district and will not burden tax rates of Tully residents. This is a critical need for these residents and something we are working very hard to bring to completion.

I want to announce that the Tully Parks and Rec. Department has named a new chairperson from within their ranks. Jeff Proulx will be taking over the position that Gary Hayman served the community in for many years. We welcome Jeff and again thank Gary for his many years of service.

We will also be dedicating a new road within the Town. This road is a segment of road formally referred to as part of Tully Center Road (turning north by Walburger's garage). The road will be named "Hazel's Way". The necessary road improvements were totally funded by the property developers and will be maintained by the Town going forward.

The Town has scheduled a public hearing on 8/11/21 at 7:00 PM. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss if we should opt out of the new NY State provision allowing the sale of marijuana within the Town.
