## **Update from Supervisor Masters**

I would like to take this opportunity to recognize the wonderful job that out Highway Departments did, as they dealt with the "unprecedented" rainfall and resulting damage last month. After the massive job of clearing Hollenbeck Rd, they delt with numerous washouts and debris on our roads. Thank you for your efforts!

I also want to thank Nancy Chawgo, and all involved in organizing our 9/11 Community Day. It was a great success.

We have had numerous requests from citizen groups, as well as, individuals, requesting we work to lower the speed limits on roads within our lake communities. This is especially relevant to the beach area on Lake Rd.

First, let me explain that, the Town of Tully can't simply change the speed, even on Town roads. We need to work through the County and State DOT.

In January of 2020, I filed a request to Onondaga County outlining the roads and the requested reductions. In Feb. 2020, I received a response requesting to fill in a "TE-9 form." I did that on the 3rd of Feb. We have followed up on this request on numerous occasions, verifying that the County did forward the request to the State DOT. Our Town Clerk also followed up, and was told by the State DOT that they have our request, but they "are extremely backlogged."

After receiving an email from one of our citizens expressing extreme frustration, last week, I again called the State DOT and spoke to an Engineer. He indicated the engineering review had been done, but further study was needed. I indicated that after 1 year and 7 months, it would seem reasonable that I should be able to set some expectation with our citizens. I requested a response from the Dept. Supervisor and am currently waiting for this response. (Note: the supervisor was out that week with a family emergency.) I will be following up on this, and if I do not receive a response in reasonable time frame, I will be contacting our State representative. Be assured I share your frustrations and will continue to work on this problem.

## **Southern Knights End Season In Style**

The first week of August meant southern hospitality, oppressive heat and humidity and BASEBALL for the Knights in Myrtle Beach at the Ripken Complex. After four pool play games, the Knights faced an elimination game. 
