Update from Supervisor Masters

We have an opening for a Fire Commissioner, to be appointed by the Town. We do have an incumbent that wishes to continue. However, it is our tradition and policy to solicit interested parties for consideration.

If you are interested in this position, and are a Tully resident, we welcome your application. Please submit a cover letter and resume, attention Tully Town Clerk, PO Box 206, Tully, NY 13159.

Our Highway Department is asking “walkers and joggers” to please wear light color reflective clothing. It is extremely hard to see these individuals, and this causes a dangerous situation.

I receive numerous phone calls from citizens asking questions or for support on issues. Often the caller does not leave their name or phone contact information. It is my desire to follow up on all calls so please remember to leave your name and contact information. Please be clear and speak slowly and clearly.

I have also received several calls concerning the allowance or probation of cannabis sales and use lounges in Tully. Please understand it was on the recent ballot only in the Village of Tully, where it was approved. The Town disallowed this by Board action prior to the recent election. (a public hearing was held prior to this action)

We did this for two reasons.

One: it is our understanding, if you preclude this now you can allow it later, but if you allow it, it cannot be changed. This drove us to wait and see how it plays out elsewhere.

Two: some board members basic belief that they did not approve of it.

Town Highway News

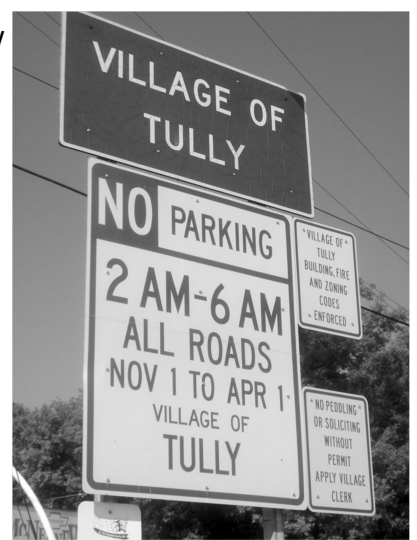
With the winter season fast approaching, please remember the parking rules and laws that are in place for the Village, Town, and State.

There is no parking from 2am—6am on all roads from November 1st to April 1st in the village of Tully. This is for your and your car’s safety.

Article 1219 of the New York Vehicle Traffic law prohibits plowing, shoveling, or blowing of snow into a street or highway. This law also covers other items likely to pose a hazard to motorists including glass, nails, wire, cans, etc. Fines for a first offense include up to a \$150 fine and/or 15 days in jail, plus applicable surcharges.

This law also stipulates that anyone that places or permits to be placed upon any highway any material which interferes with the safe use of the highway shall immediately remove the some or cause it to be removed. This includes SNOW! If you are a homeowner and you hire a person to plow your driveway, an you permit him/her to plow snow into the road, you could be cited under this law.

The town highway asks that you respect the law as laid out above. This is for the safety of all. Compliance makes it easier for everyone concerned.
