Tree planting at the Wastewater Treatment Plant

A gorgeous fall day served as a backdrop for 45 area residents who volunteered to plant 3.25 acres of trees and shrubs at the Tully Wastewater Treatment Plant on Saturday, October 15.

Community organizations and individuals offered their time and energy to put 600 plantings along the creek bank, ranging from maples to dogwoods, in hopes of holding the creek



banks in place, preventing downstream runoff and pollution, and sequestering carbon. In addition, having the field populated by deep-rooted trees and shrubs rather than shallow-rooted grass will remove that acreage from mowing, resulting in lower use of gasoline, thus fewer greenhouse gas emissions, and reduced cost to the Village because of lower equipment and maintenance expense and fewer man-hours.

Our area has been blessed with individuals and groups who showed their volunteer spirit by helping. Many thanks are owed to Future Farmers of America, Boy Scouts, Interact, Rotary, National Honor Society, St. Leo's Church, Tully Lakes and Kettle Lakes groups, Tully Village Board, and Tully Community Garden. Special thanks are due to Carley Anderson and Dan Ray for helping with the creek crossing pathway.

The trees and shrubs were provided through a grant written by the Onondaga County Soil and Water Conservation District in conjunction with Upper Susquehanna Coalition. The planting was masterfully directed by Teresa Link, from Soil and Water with the assist of one helper. Although she had been promised help from her own contractors and volunteers, none were able to come. Nonetheless, the planting went off without a hitch. Our local volunteers took over management once trained, assisted with cleanup afterward, and helped devour the donuts and pizza.

Computer Safety Tips

As it is that time of season again, I want to share some important safety tips before you go online.

Security and passwords

- Use strong and unique passwords (more at connectsafely.org/passwords)
- Don't automatically click on links in emails. They can be fake and lead you to malicious sites. Type in the web address yourself. When in doubt call the bank or other company that sent you the email.
- Make sure your phone is locked. Secure your smartphone with a PIN (minimum 4 digit number), password, fingerprint or other method.
- Don't respond to anyone who tells you your computer is infected with a virus even if they claim they're with Microsoft, Apple or your internet provider.

Shopping, banking, donating and contests

- If it sounds too good to be true, it's too good to be true. You
 can't win a contest you didn't enter and there are no
 Nigerian princes willing to send you money.
- Only shop at reputable online merchants. When in doubt, ask around.
- Never send cash or wire money, Use credit cards if possible, otherwise debit cards or legitimate payment services like PayPal.
- When shopping or banking look for secure sites where the web address starts with HTTPS. The "s" stands for "secure.
- Do some research before donating online to make sure the charity is legitimate and that the money is going to the right place.
- Never give out your social security number, Medicare number or any other identification unless you're sure it's necessary, such as applying for credit.

Using apps and unknown websites

- Read reviews before downloading smartphone apps.
- Pay attention to what permission smartphone apps ask for before you download or use them.
- Know and use the privacy settings for any device, app or service you use.
- Don't provide any personal information on a website unless you are certain it's legitimate and, even then, only if necessary.
