Tully Joint Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee Facilitating Community Open House and Public Hearing for Joint Comprehensive Plan Update

Tully, NY – The Town and Village of Tully invite all residents and community stakeholders to attend a Community Open House and Public Hearing, facilitated by the Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee, for the Joint Comprehensive Plan Update. The event will be held at the Tully Municipal Building (5833 Meetinghouse Rd, Tully, NY 13159) on Wednesday, May 31st. The Community Open House will take place from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM and the Public Hearing will begin at 7:30 PM. Please visit the project website, the Town website, or the Village website to review the draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update online. Hard copies are also available at the Tully Municipal Building and Tully Free Library.

A comprehensive plan serves as a guide for community decision-makers and stakeholders by documenting existing local conditions; defining the community's vision, goals, objectives, and action items that are to be pursued over the next decade; mapping the desired future distribution of land uses; and providing a framework for the implementation of high priority action items. The Town and Village's current Joint Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2005. Due to changing community conditions and regional trends, an update to the Plan commenced in early 2023. This initiative is being spearheaded by a Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee, with assistance from a team of community planning professionals from Barton & Loguidice. Since the kick-off of the Joint Comprehensive Plan Update process, public input was solicited through a Community Survey (available mid-March to mid-April, 2023) and a Community Open House (held on March 30th, 2023). The concerns and opportunities voiced by community members were then utilized to shape a draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update, now ready for public review and comment.

The Community Open House on May 31st (starting at 6:00 PM) will be an opportunity for community members to learn about the draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update and to provide their feedback. The Community Open House will begin with a brief presentation providing an overview of the draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update process and content and will then break out into a poster gallery session. Members of the Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee and the consultant team will be available to answer your questions and collect and discuss your feedback.

The Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee Public Hearing (starting at 7:30 PM and held in accordance with NYS Law) will be another opportunity to provide feedback on the draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update. After hearing public testimony, the Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee will decide whether or not to pass a resolution to forward the draft Joint Comprehensive Plan Update to the Town and Village Boards for consideration for adoption.

All residents, business and property owners, community leaders, and individuals with an interest in the future of the Town and Village of Tully are welcome to participate in the Community Open House and Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee Public Hearing.

'Benadryl Challenge' on TikTok Is Dangerous, Experts Say

- A challenge posted on TikTok known as the "Benadryl challenge" encourages viewers to take large doses of the antihistamine to induce hallucinations.
- Experts say excessive doses of Benadryl can cause serious health issues, even causing death in some situations.
- Johnson & Johnson, the manufacturer of Benadryl, has posted a warning about the challenge, and TikTok officials said they've been removing posts that publicize the challenge.



The latest challenge in the news is the "Benadryl challenge" that appeared on TikTok, a popular social media video platform. The idea was to take a whole lot of Benadryl (diphenhydramine, a common antihistamine) in order to cause a high, with hallucinations. While it's true that diphenhydramine can make you high and make you hallucinate, when you take too much of it you can also have seizures, pass out, have heart problems, or even die. And indeed, emergency rooms across the country have treated overdoses of diphenhydramine, and at least one death has been attributed to the challenge.
