The Southern Knights baseball club prevailed in the Cortland State tournament held July 26-28. The semi-finals featured a rematch from pool play with the Cayuga Bombers. This time the Bombers had no answer as the Knights prevailed 9-5 behind the pitching of Cooper Marko (CBA). Marko also contributed 2 hits, 2 RBI and 2 runs scored at the plate.

In the championship game, the Rochester Canes gave the Knights all they could handle. Tied after 6 innings behind strong pitching from Sean Olley (Skan.) and Griffon Filighera (JD) the stage was set for late game heroics. The Knights turned to their ace, Ben Lovell (CBA), but when neither teamed scored in the 7th, extra innings were on tap. With nerves and energy high, Zeke Mohat (Tully) put a ball in play the Canes couldn't handle. Marko and Keelan Marren (Skan.) followed with hits and Lovell slammed the door in the bottom of the inning for a hard fought 7-4 victory.

Fittingly, the Knights will wrap up their long, successful campaign, August 8-10 in the PBT New York Open, with some games slated for Tully. The Knights played 26 tournament games this summer, highlighted by a 6 game road trip through Ohio.

Broadband has Arrived!

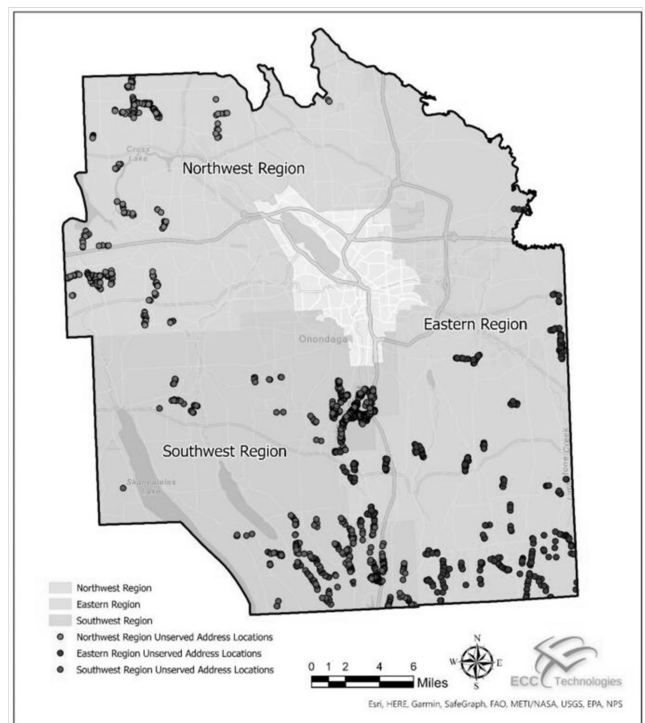
Dave Knapp paid a visit to the July meeting of the Tully Town Board to announce that the Onondaga County Broadband initiative has neared completion.

The project was awarded to Verizon and was expected to cost \$18 million. Onondaga County was to use about \$11 million in American Rescue plan funding and Verizon contributed the rest.

The need for more reliable internet access was apparent during the pandemic and has become more imperative considering Micron's plan to invest \$100 billion in the community over the next decade.

In 2021 a survey was sent to all county residences to identify Central New York areas with inadequate broadband service. The survey and supervisors identified over 1,500 locations in rural Onondaga County in need of service. Those individuals that do not have broadband access are encouraged to contact Verizon to have it installed. Installation to your residence is covered by the County program.

Currently residents of Tully and the surrounding areas have begun having the service installed, including Dave Knapp.

A HAZARDOUS SITUATION

A hazardous situation exists on Route 80 at the intersections of Lake Rd and RT 281 under the RT 81 overpass. People are using the shoulder as a right-hand turn lane endangering runners, walkers, kids walking to the beach, people with strollers, etc. Route 80 is a single lane, and at the light, I've been passed on the right numerous times in my car and have had to jump out of the way while walking.

It's been 38 years since I took my permit test, so I needed to look this up. According to NEW YORK STATE DRIVER'S MANUAL AND PRACTICE TESTS, "solid lines along the side of the road tell you where its edge is, where the travel lane ends and the shoulder begins. It is illegal to drive across the edge line except when told to by a police officer or when allowed by an official sign."

There is no such sign. Please just relax, wait for your turn, and be safe. A concerned Tully resident.
