ICE HARVESTING

The harvesting of ice on the Tully Kettle Lakes was a major industry dating back over 150 years, employing several hundred people in the area, up to the



1930's. Once harvested the ice was stored in one of four warehouses in the village and used to transport local farmers' milk via the railroad to as far away as New York City. It was also stored in these warehouses for door-to-door delivery to residences for use in their ice boxes up until the refrigerator came about in the 1930's. Many farmers had ice houses on their property for their own milk storage. The Estey Ice House is located near Green Lake and has been used there for storing ice from previous harvesting events.
