All items must be less than 10 feet in length.

All oil, gas and antifreeze products, *which are not acceptable for disposal*, must be drained from tanks and equipment.

IF YOU HAVE UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS ON BOARD, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON SITE

WILL ACCEPT: Most General Rubbish, Appliances, Metal, Computers (Flat Screens Only), Electronics, Lawn & Garden Waste, Vehicle Batteries, Empty Drums and Pails cut in half

Tires will be accepted off the rim at a cost -

MOZART'S REQUIEM TO BE PERFORMED IN TULLY

On April 13, 2025 (Palm Sunday), a group of local singers and orchestral players will perform Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's timeless masterpiece, Requiem, at the Tully United Community Church at 3:00 pm. Admission will be free, but donations will be gratefully accepted.

Stephen B. Wilson, SUNY Cortland Professor of Music, Emeritus, will conduct an orchestra of twenty-three players, a forty-voice chorus, and a quartet of soloists.

These musicians will perform Robert D. Levin's most recent completion of Mozart's originally unfinished work, which he published in spring, 1993. The orchestra will consist of two clarinets, two bassoons, a trio of trombones (alto, tenor, and bass), timpani, organ, and strings (violins, violas, cellos, and bass).

Dr. Wilson will be leading the ensemble in this work for only the second time in his lengthy career as conductor. He first performed in 1985, when he was a new member of the music department at SUNY Cortland.

The concert is presented and sponsored by the Tully United Community Church and Tully United for The Arts.

We've been asked to pass along some important information regarding fire safety in your own home. The Tully Hose Company has responded to incidents in the last few months where an extinguisher has kept families from experiencing tragedy. There is no age limit on using a fire extinguisher, and even kids can be trained on how to operate one safely and effectively. Even if you don't expect your children to use an extinguisher themselves, it's nevertheless important to have an extinguisher easily accessible.

It is important to regularly inspect your extinguisher. By conducting routine inspections, you proactively verify that your fire extinguisher is in optimal working condition and poised to handle any potential fire hazard. These inspections not only ensure the immediate availability of a functional extinguisher but also serve as a preventive measure

against malfunctions or failures that could lead to devastating consequences.

Know Your Fire Extinguisher

FIRE EXTINGUISHER INSPECTION

Home fire extinguishers should be checked regularly to help make sure they are ready for use. With proper training and education, fire extinguishers can save lives and property.

- ◇ Make sure the extinguisher is unconcealed in its designated location.
- ◇ Be sure the tamper seal of the cylinder remains intact and check the cylinder for obvious defects such as a clogged nozzle, leakage, physical damage or corrosion
- ◇ Affirm that both the pressure gauge and indicator are in the operable range of function
- ◇ Confirm that the extinguisher is full, this can be simply done by lifting the extinguisher
- ◇ Verify that the issued instructions on the nameplate are comprehensible and facing outwards
- ◇ Check the condition of the hose, bottle, and nozzle of the extinguishers

5 KEY PLACES TO KEEP FIRE EXTINGUISHERS IN YOUR HOME

1. **The Kitchen**
The kitchen fire extinguisher should be within 30 feet of the stove so it can be accessed quickly in an emergency. But it shouldn't be installed in the immediate vicinity of the stove, where smoke and flames could block access.
2. **Near Sources of Heat**
Again, as with cooking equipment, don't keep the extinguisher right next to the source of heat, but a safe distance away.
3. **Each Floor of your Home**
Keep at least one fire extinguisher on every floor of your home, including the basement and attic, if you have them.
4. **The Garage**
Garages, workshops, and sheds are typically full of combustible materials, especially things like gas canisters, oils, and cleaning products.
5. **The Bedrooms**
The majority of fires happen at night, so every bedroom in your house should have easy access to a fire extinguisher—even children's rooms.
