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Highway

John Herold reported on the following:

- We had a good month
- We went out 51 times in January and so far this month, 15 times in February.
- There is a shortage of salt; we're fine as a town; not nervous, just concerned. The other towns in the county all agreed to help each other out. There are no safety issues.
- Had a few repairs
- John talked about FEMA and a particular project he had planned, Bromley and Hollenbeck Roads, and needing John Masters to sign the contract for that project. Brief discussion after which came the following motion:

RESOLUTION 33-25

Motion to authorize Supervisor Masters to sign the contract with Paul Sheneman contingent upon John Herold receiving the extension on the FEMA execution. Motion by Supervisor Masters, second by Councilor Snavlin. Motion carried.

Mr. Herold added that this was all grant money, that no taxpayer money was to be spent on this project.

Ambulance

Fire Captain Chad Wakula reported on the following:

- Number of EMS calls for January was 64
- New ambulance will be delivered 2-14-2025
- United Radio is coming 2-20-2025 to install the radios, MDT and modem
- A-1 had thermostats replaced
- The old A-1 and one of the old stretchers can be declared surplus at some point

Parks & Recreation

No report.

Fire

Councilor Speziale reported that the fire department applied for a DEC grant and was awarded \$5000. Brief discussion ensued. It was also reported that they're having a chicken BBQ this weekend.

Updates from the Town Supervisor

Mr. Masters reported that he had a 20-year contract from the county for their use of our highway garage that he would need authorization to sign.

RESOLUTION 34-25

Motion to authorize Supervisor Masters to sign the contract with the county for the lease of our highway garage. Motion by Councilor Snavlin, second by Councilor Meixell. Motion carried.

(Masters, Snavlin, Speziale, Meixell) Ayes 4 Nays 0

Next, Mr. Masters asked our town attorney to give an update on the solar development on Sky High Road. Mr. DeMore responded that he had emailed the solar company and let them know that their permit was about to run out, and so they asked for an extension to May 2026. Bob reported that they hadn't done anything at this point in time. He also reported on a Host Community Benefit agreement as well as a PILOT agreement and having them sign those agreements before we grant an extension. Brief discussion.

RESOLUTION 35-25

Motion to authorize our Town Attorney to negotiate both the Host Community Benefit agreement and the PILOT agreement with the solar company developing on Sky High Road. Motion made by Supervisor Masters, seconded by Councilor Snavlin. Motion carried.

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RESOLUTION 36-25

Motion to authorize the town supervisor to send a letter or sign on to the Lafayette letter to USGS on the landslide risks in Tully and surrounding areas with regard to wind turbines. Motion by Councilor Snavlin and seconded by Councilor Meixell. Motion carried.

(Masters, Snavlin, Speziale, Meixell) Ayes 4 Nays 0

Legal: Mr. DeMore also discussed burying the cables for the Shirley and Tully North solar projects. He stated that our laws require that they be buried. It's section B of our Local Law 1 of 2020. Brief discussion ensued.
